The Demographics

The 45-49 year old age group is the most populous.



This group represents 8.4% of the population, or 10,675 people.

The fastest growing group is the 60-64 age group.



This group has increased by 1,700 residents since 2006.

Population of 126,748 in 2011.



The Population has increased by 5.3% since 2006.

Children age 0-14 represent 19.2% of the population.



This is higher than the national (16.7%) and provincial (17%) averages.

The median age is 38 years.



This is up from 36.4 years in 2006.

The Realities

Work



23% of the employed labor force are in sales and service occupations.

17% are in trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations.

Food



In Waterloo Region, the cost of eating healthy for a family of four in 2015 was \$842.75 per month.

This is an increase of 5% since 2014.

Income



The median after-tax income of lone parent families in 2010 was \$41,304.

For couple families with children it was \$87,627, and \$60,620 for those without children.

Education



29.4% of adults age 25-64 have a high school education.

55.3% have a post-secondary education.

15.3% have no certificate, degree or diploma.

17.3% of families are lone-parent



Lone-parent families make approximately \$45,000 less than couple-with-children families.



80% of lone-parents are female.

4 in 5

12% of the population, or 15,210 people, are living at or below the Low Income Measure - After-Tax Line.



5,005 of these people are children under 18.

In Ontario, the low income cut-off for annual income is \$22,720.



The annual income for a person on minimum wage is \$20,075.



To be considered affordable, a household should spend no more than 30% of its income on housing costs.

Many households spend more than this.
