



The Demographics

<p>The 0-4 year old age group is the most populous.</p>  <p>This group represents 7.4% of the population, or 1,695 people.</p>	<p>Population of 23,145 in 2011.</p>  <p>The Population has increased by 17.7% since 2006.</p>	<p>Children age 0-14 represent 20.7% of the population.</p>  <p>This is higher than the national (16.7%) and provincial (17%) averages.</p>
<p>The fastest growing group is the 65-69 age group.</p>  <p>This group has increased by 46.6% since 2006.</p>		<p>The median age is 38.6 years.</p>  <p>This is down from 38.9 years in 2006.</p>

The Realities

<p>Work</p>  <p>19.5% of the employed labor force are in sales and service occupations.</p> <p>16.6% are in trades, transport and equipment operators and related occupations.</p>	<p>Food</p>  <p>In Waterloo Region, the cost of eating healthy for a family of four in 2015 was \$842.75 per month.</p> <p>This is an increase of 5% since 2014.</p>	
<p>Income</p>  <p>The median after-tax income of lone parent families in 2010 was \$49,705.</p> <p>For couple families with children it was \$99,788, and \$74,995 for those without children.</p>	<p>Education</p>  <p>22.4% of adults age 25-64 have a high school education.</p> <p>60% have a post-secondary education.</p> <p>17.6% have no certificate, degree or diploma.</p>	
<p>8.5% of families are lone-parent led.</p>  <p>Lone-parent families make approximately \$50,000 less than couple-with-children families.</p>	<p>6.2% of the population, or 1,400 people, are living at or below the Low Income Measure - After-Tax Line.</p>  <p>495 of these people are children under 18.</p>	<p>In Ontario, the low income cut-off for annual income is \$22,720.</p>  <p>The annual income for a person on minimum wage is \$20,075.</p>
<p>75% of lone-parents are female.</p> <p>3 in 4</p> 	<p>To be considered affordable, a household should spend no more than 30% of its income on housing costs.</p> <p>Many households spend more than this.</p> <p>Homeowners 13%</p> <p>Renters 34%</p> 	<p>In Waterloo Region, 1 in 4 adults had an income of less than \$14,000 in 2010.</p> <p>1 in 4</p>
